



Application residence document: residence with EU family member for family members other than partner and child

About this form

Your family member (who is not your parent or partner) has the nationality of a European Union (EU) or European Economic Area (EEA) country or of Switzerland, but not Dutch nationality. Your family member is an EU citizen. You yourself are not an EU citizen. To live with your family member in the Netherlands, you need an EU residence document. Use this form to apply for this document. Do you already have a document for residence with this EU family member? And is that about to expire? Use this form to apply for a new document. Make sure the IND has received the application before your document expires. But no more than 3 months before the expiry.

Before filling in the form

- Check the [requirements for this residence document](#) at ind.nl/en/residence-family-EU.
- You can only submit this application if you are in the Netherlands. Go to netherlandsworldwide.nl and [check if you need a visa to come to the Netherlands](#).
- Is the application for a child under 12 years of age? Then a parent with parental authority submits the application. Any reference to 'you' in this form means the child for whom the application is being made. You can read about [parental authority](#) at rijksoverheid.nl.
- First, collect all required documents. Read about how to have official foreign documents [legalised and translated at](#) ind.nl/en/documents.
- If you fail to submit sufficient documents and/or do not have official foreign documents legalised and translated, it will take longer for the IND to decide. The IND can also reject your application for that reason.



- Do you already have a residence document? And is this document expired or about to expire? You may be able to apply for a residence document that has more benefits for you. Read about the [residence document for permanent residency for Union citizens](https://ind.nl/en/permanent-residence-EU) at ind.nl/en/permanent-residence-EU. Are you not eligible for that? What does this form consist of?

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Filling in the form

Fill in the form digitally and then print it. Or print the form and then fill it in with pen. Always use a black or blue pen. Answer the open questions in block letters. Choose a selection box by filling it completely. If you made a mistake, cross out the incorrect box. And then fill in the correct box. Print the form in black and white or colour, on A4 paper and in full size.

After your application

- This application requires payment. You will receive a letter explaining how to pay. View the [costs of the application](#) on ind.nl/en/fees. If a residence document is not issued to you, you will not receive a refund.
- The IND usually issues a residence endorsement (sticker) to be placed in your passport. This shows that you are permitted to stay in the Netherlands, at least until the IND has made a decision. You will receive a letter explaining how to obtain this sticker.
- The [decision period for your application](#) is listed on ind.nl/en/decision-periods. Sometimes it takes longer, for example if not all documents are included with the application.
- The decision on your application is also set out in a letter from the IND.

SUBMITTING DOCUMENTS

Explanation of documents

- Always submit the general documents with this form. And the documents that apply to your situation:
 - A. General: submit for each situation
 - B. Caring parent of EU citizen up to 18 years of age
 - C. Parent, grandparent or great-grandparent
 - D. Grandchild or great-grandchild up to 21 years of age of EU citizen or of married/registered partner
 - E. Grandchild or great-grandchild up to 18 years of age of unmarried/non-registered partner of the EU citizen
 - F. Other family member
- The documents you have to submit in your situation are included in the lists that follow. You do not have to submit the lists with your application

- The documents are an important part of your application. You can prove that you meet the requirements with documents. You will need to request many official documents from the government of your country of origin.
- Have official foreign documents [legalised and translated](#). Read about how to do this at [ind.nl/en/translation-and-legalisation-of-documents](#).
- If it says, 'for example', you may choose which documents to include. The more different documents you submit, the better the IND can assess if you meet the requirements.
- If you fail to submit sufficient different documents, it will take longer for the IND to decide. The IND can also reject your application. Because we cannot properly assess if you meet the requirements.
- Always submit copies of original documents. Copies of certificates and passports must be in colour. The same applies for photos. The rest may be a black-and-white copy.

From both of you

Copy of proof of residence in the Netherlands

If you are not registered in the Personal Records Database (BRP), you have to submit copies of documents showing that you live in the Netherlands. For example, a tenancy/purchase agreement for a home, proof of payment of rent, copies of bank statements, energy bills and/or other bills showing your name and address. Statement and proof in case of special facts or situations

Are there any special facts or situations that the IND needs to know about? About you, the EU citizen or both of you? Then you have to submit a letter explaining what is going on, and copies of (official) supporting documents.

B. Caring parent of EU citizen up to 18 years of age

Copy of proof of being caring parent

- Submit copies of documents showing that you currently care for your child and did so previously. In the Netherlands and/or abroad. For example, submit a letter in which you describe your care and upbringing tasks. And explain the family situation from the birth of your child until now. Include copies of as many documents as possible from independent and impartial individuals and organisations that support your statement. Also answer the following questions in your letter: What would change in the life of your child if you were not allowed to live in the Netherlands? Is there a special situation, for example regarding the family, school, support, social network, care, or health of the child?
- Is there another parent? Then you also have to include a statement from that parent. In this letter, the other parent describes what your tasks are in the care and upbringing of the child. And the family situation from the birth of your child until now. Include copies of as many documents as possible from independent and

impartial individuals and organisations that support the statement. Also submit a copy of the travel document of the other parent. Only copy the page with the identity details and signature.

- Copies of photos of you with your child. From birth or from the moment you became part of the life of your child up to now. Give explanations for what is shown in the photos. Also submit photos that show your involvement in care and upbringing tasks.
- Copies of documents or statements from, for example, a general practitioner or medical specialist that show you were present during medical treatments or check-ups of your child in the Netherlands or abroad. And when this was.
- Copies of documents or statements from, for example, the school of your child, sports club, daycare centre, sports coach, or maternity nurse in the Netherlands or abroad. And these should describe your care and upbringing tasks. And since when you have had these tasks.
- Copies of documents showing that you are financially supporting your child. Financial support means that you regularly pay for something for your child. For example, include copies of receipts for school supplies or clothing. You have to be able to prove that you were the one who paid. You can also include copies of documents showing that you transferred money for the care of your child.

Copy of proof of parental authority over child

Submit copies of documents showing that you have parental authority over the child. For example, a copy of an extract from the custody register or a court ruling. If you do not have parental authority, explain why in a statement. You can read about [parental authority](#) at [government.nl](#).

Copy of proof of living together with your child

Submit copies of documents showing that you and the child are living together. For example:

- Bank statements for you and your child. Preferably with debit card transactions for supermarket purchases. The statements show your name(s). And at least the last 4 IBAN digits.
- Doctor, dentist, hospital and/or other healthcare bills showing your address in the Netherlands.

Do you have to submit a declaration of consent of parent remaining behind? Then also submit a copy of The identity document of this child. This has to include their signature.

C. Parent, grandparent or great-grandparent

You are the parent, grandparent or great-grandparent of the EU citizen. Or of the married or registered partner of the EU citizen.

□ Copy of proof of financial support

Submit copies of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner gave you money regularly in the last 12 months before you came to the Netherlands. This money was for your basic needs such as food, drink and/or clothing. Or for your fixed expenses such as your rent or mortgage, energy, insurance and/or subscriptions. Also submit copies of documents showing what you spent the money on. Or of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner paid bills for you.

□ Copy of proof of financial dependency

Submit copies of documents showing that without financial help from the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner, you could not pay your basic needs and/or your fixed expenses. In the country where you are from or previously lived. For example, a

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statement from an official organisation from this country showing this. Also include a letter explaining that you were financially dependent.

□ Copy of proof of financial support in the event of \geq 4 months in the Netherlands

Have you been in the Netherlands for 4 months or more? Then you have to prove that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner also gave you money regularly in the Netherlands. This money was for your basic needs such as food, drink and/or clothing. Or for your fixed expenses such as rent or mortgage, energy, insurance and/or subscriptions. Submit copies of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner gave you money and what you spent it on. Or of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner paid bills for you.

Submit this declaration with your application. Are you unable to obtain this declaration? E. Grandchild or great-grandchild up to 18 years of age of unmarried / non-registered partner of EU citizen

Appendix: Declaration of consent of the parent(s) remaining behind

Do you have parents who have parental authority over you? Is that parent or are those parents not in the Netherlands and are they also not coming to the Netherlands? Then this parent has to or these parents have to fill in the appendix [Declaration of consent of the parent remaining behind](#) (pdf, 149 kB). This can be found at [ind.nl/declaration-consent](#). Submit this declaration with your application. Are you unable to obtain this declaration? Then download the appendix [Declaration not submitted Declaration of consent of the parent remaining behind](#) (pdf, 145 kB) at [ind.nl/en/absence-declaration](#). And submit it with your application.

Copy of identity document of the parent(s) remaining behind

Are you required to submit a declaration of consent? Then also submit a copy of this parent's identity document. This has to include their signature.

F. Other family member

You are another family member. For example, the uncle, aunt, cousin, nephew, niece, grandchild or great-grandchild aged 21 or older, or brother/sister of the EU citizen. Or of the married/registered partner of the EU citizen. And at least 1 of the following situations applies to you:

1. You are financially dependent on the EU citizen. So, you get financial support.
2. You were already living with the EU citizen in the country of origin.
3. You have serious problems with your health. Because of that, you need personal care from the EU citizen or from the partner of the EU citizen.

Submit copies of documents proving this. Submit supporting documents for all situations that apply to you.

Copy of proof of financial support

Submit copies of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner gave you money regularly in the last 12 months before you came to the Netherlands. For your basic needs such as food, drink and/or clothing. Or for your fixed expenses such as your rent or mortgage, energy, insurance and/or subscriptions. Also

submit copies of documents showing what you spent the money on. Or of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner paid bills for you.

Copy of proof of financial dependency

Submit copies of documents showing that without financial help from the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner, you could not pay your basic needs and/or your fixed expenses. In the country where you are from or previously lived. For example, a statement from an official organisation from this country showing this. Also include a letter explaining that you were financially dependent.

Copy of proof of financial support in the event of ≥ 4 months in the Netherlands

Have you been in the Netherlands for 4 months or more? Then you have to prove that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner also gave you money regularly in the Netherlands. This money was for your basic needs such as food, drink and/or clothing. Or for your fixed expenses such as rent or mortgage, energy, insurance and/or subscriptions. Submit copies of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner gave you money and what you spent it on. Or of documents showing that the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner paid bills for you.

Copy of proof of financial dependency in the event of ≥ 4 months in the Netherlands

Have you been in the Netherlands for 4 months or more? Then you have to submit copies of documents showing that without financial help from the EU citizen and/or the married/registered partner, you cannot pay your basic needs and/or fixed expenses in the Netherlands. For example, a statement from an (aid) organisation showing this. Also submit a letter explaining that you were financially dependent.

Copy of proof of living together abroad

Submit copies of documents showing that you previously lived with the EU citizen. So, in your country of origin or another country. For example, a proof of registration from a municipality abroad. From you and the EU citizen.

Copy of proof of personal care due to health

Submit copies of documents showing that you have serious health problems. And of documents showing that you are dependent on the personal care of the EU citizen and/or the partner. For example, submit a statement from an attending doctor or healthcare facility. Also submit a letter writing why you need personal care from the EU citizen and/or the partner.

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
