



Application for residence on the grounds of the Final Regulation for long-term resident children

Read the explanation before you start to fill out the form.

To whom does this form apply?

This form allows you to file an application for a residence permit if you would like to apply for residence on the grounds of the Final Regulation for long-term resident children.

Please read the information on the Final Regulation for long-term resident children on the Immigration and Naturalisation Service (IND) website first (www.ind.nl). Here you will find information about the conditions and the application procedure.

Important! All ongoing procedures for applications on the grounds of the Definitive Regulation for long-term resident children, including appeal procedures (whether or not to higher courts) will be assessed on the basis of the Final Regulation. In that case you will not have to file a new application.

If you were staying in the Netherlands on 29 January 2019 in a Reception location of the COA (including a family centre and a freedom restricted location) or were under the supervision of NIDOS, the IND will ex officio (automatically) reassess your rejected application according to the applicable conditions. Your earlier application qualifies for a reassessment if it was rejected exclusively on the basis of the cooperation criterion. If your earlier application was (also) rejected for other reasons, your earlier application does not qualify for reassessment. If you qualify for reassessment of your earlier application on the grounds of the 'Definitive Regulation for long-term resident children', you do not have to fill in this form. You do not have to take any action and you do not have to pay any fees.

If you were staying in the Netherlands on 29 January 2019 but not in a COA centre (including a family centre and a freedom restricted location) or were not under the guardianship of NIDOS, the IND will not reassess your application ex officio (automatically). In that case, it cannot be stated with enough certainty that you were in the Netherlands on 29 January 2019. Also, in that case there is not enough certainty about your residence address and your current family composition. You must then fill in this form and submit it to the IND to request the IND to reassess your application. The IND will then assess whether your earlier application does qualify for reassessment after all. If your application qualifies for this reassessment, you do not have to pay any fees. If your application does not qualify for reassessment, it will be considered a new application. You will then have to pay a fee.

If you were staying in the Netherlands on 29 January 2019, but do not qualify for reassessment and would like to file a new application, you must fill in this form and submit it to the IND. As usual, you will have to pay a fee.

This form can be used by main applicants invoking the Final Regulation, as well as their family members.

For the purposes of the IND, family members are:

- parents;
- minor brothers or sisters who were under age on 29 January 2019;
- adult brothers and sisters who were still part of the family on 29 January 2019.

At the moment of assessment, the actual family relationship must still exist.

Filing an application

File your application within two weeks after the effective date of the Final Regulation. The Final Regulation becomes effective after publication. Your written application must have been received no later than two weeks after publication. This deadline will also be available on the IND website (www.ind.nl) after publication of the Final Regulation. Make sure you fully complete and sign this form and the appendices. You do not have to enclose any proof for the purpose of assessment against the Final Regulation. The IND will assess whether you qualify by means of the information known about you. If the IND needs additional information about you, you will be given the opportunity to provide it separately. You are, however, required to fill in the following appendices:

- Antecedents certificate
- Declaration to revoke pending procedures
- Family members of children staying on grounds of the Final regulation for children staying on a long-term basis (if applicable)

- You are a minor child and have actually resided in the Netherlands for at least 3 years;
- You would like to stay with a family member who has an asylum residence permit but you have a different nationality from your family member;
- You want to reside with your minor child because you are the only carer parent;
- You resided in another Member State as a holder of a European blue card;
- You are the victim of human trafficking and you are unwilling or unable to report this to the police or collaborate in another way with the criminal investigation and prosecution of the human trafficker because of serious threats, and/or a medical or psychological impairment and/or your being a minor;
- You do not have a residence permit and are a victim of or witness reporting human trafficking and are unable or unwilling to report this to the police or collaborate in another way with the criminal investigation and prosecution of the human trafficker because of compelling circumstances;
- You do not have a residence permit and you have fallen victim to (or might fall victim to) domestic or honour-related violence;
- For health reasons, you are unable to apply for an MVV in the country of origin;
- You are a victim of or witness reporting human trafficking;
- You are unable to leave the Netherlands because this is in breach of Article 8 of the ECHR;
- Other: special and individual circumstances apply to you and you cannot return to the country of origin to apply for an MVV.

2 Tuberculosis

You would like to apply for a residence permit in the Netherlands. You may have been tested (and possibly treated) for tuberculosis (TB). This depends on your situation.

- you have already undergone a TB test in the Netherlands. Enclose an original and recent 'TB test referral form' with the application. This form is proof that you have undergone a TB test in the Netherlands. The form may not be more than 6 months old; or
- you have not undergone a TB test in the Netherlands yet. In that case, fill in the Appendix 'Declaration of intent to undergo a TB test' and enclose it with the application. You must sign this appendix yourself.

When you are in the Netherlands, make an appointment for the test with the Municipal Health Service (GGD) in the region where you live/ are going to live (see www.ggd.nl for more information). Please bring the Appendix 'TB test Referral form' with you to the GGD. The GGD will subsequently send the form to the IND.

4 Biometric data (fingerprints and passport photo), signature and Antecedents Certificate

- You must have your fingerprints and a facial image (passport photo) taken for the purpose of establishing your identity. These biometric data are also needed to produce a residence document. In addition, your signature is required for the residence document. Please send the application form to the IND by post. You will then receive a letter from the IND. In this letter, the IND will explain when you can have your fingerprints and passport photo taken and when you can sign.
- Enclose the completed and signed Antecedents Certificate Appendix with the application form.

Appendix Declaration of intent to undergo a TB test

In order to obtain a residence permit, you (or the person you represent) must be prepared to undergo a tuberculosis (TB) test and - if necessary - treatment. If you submit the completed declaration of intent to undergo a TB test to the IND together with your application (and also meet all other conditions), the IND will grant you a residence permit as soon as possible.

You are granted this permit under the express condition that you will actually undergo a TB test within three months after having received your residence permit. Should it become clear after the issue of a residence permit that - despite signing the declaration of intent - you failed to undergo a TB test within the period of three months, this may result in a cancellation of the permit that was granted.

Enclose the completed and signed declaration of intent with your application before you make an appointment with the Municipal Health Service. In doing so, you declare that you are prepared to undergo a TB test and, if necessary, TB treatment. For the appointment with the Municipal Health Service, you must complete the referral form as much as possible (part 1) and take it with you.

The obligation to undergo the test does not apply if you are a national of one of the countries listed in the appendix 'Exemption from the obligation to undergo a tuberculosis (TB) test'. Nor does the obligation to undergo the test apply if you have an EU residence permit for long-term residents issued by another EU country or are his/her family member and were already admitted to another EU country as a family member of the long-term resident.
