



Application residence permit: residence with family member article 8 ECHR

Application by sponsor

About this form

You are a Dutch national or you have a residence permit in the Netherlands. You have a family member living abroad who wants to come live with you in the Netherlands. This family member does not meet the requirements for any other residence permit to live with family. As a result, you use this form to apply for a residence permit under article 8 ECHR (right to family life). A visa to travel to the Netherlands is also required in some cases. This visa is called a provisional residence permit (MVV). Does your family member already have this residence permit? And is it about to expire? Then use this form to apply for an extension. Make sure the IND has received the application before the document expires. But no more than 3 months before the expiry.

SUBMITTING DOCUMENTS

Explanation of documents

- Submit the documents with this form. These documents are stated in the lists that follow. These are:
 - A. General: general documents that you usually need to submit, such as proof of identity and an antecedent's certificate.
 - B. Situations: documents you need to submit to prove certain situations. Only submit documents that apply to your situation.
- You do not need to send the pages with this list with your application.
- The documents are an important part of your application. You can prove that you meet the requirements with documents. You will need to request many official documents from the government of your country of origin.
- Read [how to have official foreign documents legalised and translated](https://ind.nl/en/documents) on ind.nl/en/documents.
- If it says, 'for example', you may choose which documents to include for the situation. The more different documents you submit, the better the IND can assess your application. If you fail to submit sufficient different documents, it will take longer for the IND to decide. And the IND can reject your application.
- If you are submitting any statements: A statement is a document in which you or someone else says something about the situation. This could be a statement from yourself, family, friends or acquaintances or an impartial person or organisation. Statements from independent and impartial individuals and organisations count most heavily in assessing your application.
- The statement must be clearly legible and preferably typed. The person making the statement must sign the document.
- Are you including a statement from the other parent of your child, a relative, friend or acquaintance? Then submit a copy the ID of this person.
- Is an organisation's statement on official letterhead, with a stamp attached? Then you do not need to submit a copy of the passport of the person signing the statement. If the statement is not on official letterhead and without a stamp, this copy should be included.
- Always submit copies of original documents. Copies of certificates and passports must be in colour. The same applies for photos. The rest may be a black-and-white copy.

Submit copies of (a combination of) documents showing the (family) relationship between you and the family member. And showing the family situation of the family member in their country of origin. For example:

- a birth certificate or deed of acknowledgment
- an adoption declaration
- a family booklet
- a family register extract.

If you would like to prove a family relationship with a DNA test, then submit a copy of a DNA test result from an accredited laboratory. Accredited laboratories in the Netherlands are listed at www.rva.nl. And international ones can be found at www.ilac.org.

☐ **Statement in the absence of proof of family relationship**

Are you unable to prove that you are related by means of official documents or a DNA test? You have to submit a letter explaining why this is the case. In any event, explain why you and/or your family member never had these documents. Or why you and/or your family member had the documents at one point but no longer do. Also explain how you and/or your family member managed to get by in your country of origin without documents. Submit as many copies as possible of any documents that prove this.

B. Situations

Only submit the documents that apply to your situation.

Living together

☐ **Copy of proof of living together**

Did you previously live with your family member? Then submit copies of documents showing this. For example:

- documents relating to your fixed expenses, such as rent or mortgage payments, energy bills, TV and internet subscriptions, or tax assessments for both of you.
- documents relating to your and/or the work of your family member abroad. For example, an employment contract, payslips and annual statement(s). In the event of self employment: formal registration of your business, the balance sheet, profit and loss accounts and operating results.
- Documents showing that you and your family member had health insurance abroad, such as a policy document.
- Documents showing that you and your family member were registered with the foreign municipality. And during which period that was. For example, an extract from the population register. Or proof of registration and deregistration with the municipality/municipalities.

Ties with country of origin and Netherlands

☐ **Copy of proof of visit to/from family member**

Have you visited the country of origin of your family member? And/or has your family member visited the Netherlands? Then submit copies of documents showing this. For example:

- (airline) tickets, bookings and other proof of activities of you and your family member in the country of origin or the Netherlands.
- the pages with travel stamps from the travel document.

☐ **Copy of proof of living together**

Did you previously live in the country of origin of your family member? And/or did your family member previously live in the Netherlands? Then submit copies of documents showing this. For example, registration with a municipality or a purchase contract or tenancy agreement.

Financial support

☐ **Copy of proof of financial support**

Does your family member receive financial support from you? Submit copies of documents showing what you have paid on behalf of your family member. And/or showing that you have transferred money to your family member. And showing from which date your family member has been receiving financial support. This money was for your fixed expenses such as your rent or mortgage, energy, insurance and/or subscriptions.

Medical situation

☐ **Copy of proof of medical situation**

Is your family member dependent on your care and/or assistance because of problems? Or are you dependent on the care and/or assistance of your family member because of medical problems? Submit copies of documents explaining the medical situation. For example, documents from a medical specialist or other treating doctor showing the medical situation. The documents may not be more than 3 months old.

☐ **Copy of proof of dependence on care**

Submit a statement from a medical specialist or another treating doctor. This letter has to state that you or your family member are unable to carry out daily tasks for medical reasons. And what care and assistance you or your family member needs because of the medical problems. Also submit a statement in which you or your family member explains why only you or your family member can provide this care and assistance.

☐ **Copy of proof of treatment of a family member in the Netherlands**

Is your family member receiving treatment for the medical problems in the Netherlands? Send the filled in [Appendix Medical information disclosure consent form](#) (pdf, 172 kB) from [ind.nl/en/declaration-consent-medical](#). This consent form was signed no more than 6 months ago. Also submit the Appendix [Proof of medical situation of foreign national](#) (pdf, 158 kB) from [ind.nl/en/proof-medical-situation](#).

Best interests of child

☐ **Copies of proof of the best interests of the child**

Would a negative decision on this application have an adverse effect on the situation of a minor? Submit copies of documents proving why this is the case.

Reason for application

☐ **Statement and proof in case of special facts and situations**

Have you filled in question 16? Then submit copies of documents that prove what you have written.
